This activity of preparation, though exciting, has also brought to mind many sweet and rich memories of how God has worked through so many lives at Salem while we were in the Fargo building. Memories of lost loved ones, memories of faithful friends or special moments and conversations had in the building. God was there--there is no doubt about that. Please, let me remind and reassure you that God is also here now as we prepare for this change, and He will be with us into the future as we follow His will and strive to know Him better. We often do not see God working in the moment, but can always reflect back after some time has passed and recognize the mighty and merciful hand of God on our path.
